

Ans. Mr Gogon Pakrashi was the mentor of Patol Babu. He always guided Patol Babu in his acting. He always told Patol Babu whatever small part he was offered, he should never consider it below his dignity to accept that. He should make the most of the opportunity and squeeze the last drop of meaning of his lines. When Patol Babu was given only a single dialogue 'Oh' to utter in his first movie, he felt it was against his dignity to accept that role and he thought of quitting. But when he remembered what his mentor had taught him, he rehearsed for that single word many times. He performed his role so well that everyone from the director to the lead actor praised him. He even went away without taking any money for the part he had played.

OR

King Ozymandias called himself the king of kings. He was very arrogant and thought that his name, fame and power will last forever. He thought that no one could match his greatness. But he failed to realize that time can destroy everything. Now his shattered statue, half-buried in sand, the waste and ruins around the statue bear the testimony to the fact that nothing lasts forever.

The poet highlights the fact that real power lies in winning the hearts and not in ruling the weak and needy. The poem illustrates the vanity of human greatness. A man is remembered because of his good deeds and not because of the monuments he erects. Real power lies in making others happy and in helping others.

Ans. (a) Initially, Anne didn't share a very good bonding with Margot because she felt her mother was always biased towards Anne but gradually Anne found a good friend in Margot. They both were together in the concentration camp. Anne states, 'Morgot's and mummy's natures are completely strange for

me.' Her emotion were not typical for a teenage girl, especially one confined to a small space with an anxious mother and quibbling sister.

They both loved their parents but were tired of their constant interference in their decisions. They were tired of listening to their parents' comments. When at one point of time Anne felt that Margot liked Peter, Margot very clearly told Anne that she had no such feelings towards Peter. Margot was always concerned about Anne. In one of the letters, Anne wrote, 'You know how much I admire you and only hope that some of your goodness and father's goodness will rub off on me, because, in that sense, you two are a lot alike.'

In fine, at least through Anne's eyes, Margot was smarter, quieter, prettier, and more grow-up than Anne. But, the tow sisters were not close friends and did not confide in each other much. However, they did share sisterly moments. They talked about their future, and Anne asked Margot what she wanted to be when she was older though Margot remained nupterions about their plans.

OR

Otto Frank was Anne's father. He was a very understanding and affectionate father. Anne in her diary refers to him as the 'most adorable father'. He was very protective about his family. He took a lot of interest in teaching his daughters. He was a very balanced person and tried to understand the situation before getting judgemental. He supported Anne when Mrs van Daan criticized Anne, he always supported her. He was a man with minimal needs. He would take care that everyone had his share of food and then only he would have his food. He had a lot of patience and would never lose his temper. He respected everyone. Anne loved him a lot and called him Pim lovingly.

Otto Frank was also a generous man. When Anne complained about the new comes, he taught her that the most important thing was to save another Jewish life. Once the franks moved into the Secret Annex, Otto because the leader and peacemaker of the group. It was he and Anne who unpacked the family's belongings and organised the annex.

In sum, Otto Frank was truly a wise man and a loving father and husband and was clearly the lead of the Frank household. The only resident of the Annex to survive the war, Otto remained in Auschwitz until it was liberated by Russion troops in 1945.

(b) Miss Sullivan was the teacher who brought light in Helen's dark life. She had a very different way of teaching. She didn't believe in formal classroom teaching. She would often take Helen in the nature and make her understand several concepts. She explained Helen all about earth, poles, mountains, valleys and drifts in such a way that she could touch, feel and experience the things. Helen learnt faster with nature. Miss Sullivan would take Helen to the fields where men were preparing the earth for the seed. She would teach Helen how sun and rain make the ground give life to trees. She also taught her how creatures find food and shelter. She developed a love for nature in Helen and Helen also found a different kind of joy by being with nature.

In sum, Miss Sullivan was a exceptionally gifted teacher. She had innovative teaching methods. Everything she taught was illustrated by a story or a poem. Her method made grammar, math and definition interesting. She never nagged Helen and tried to make every subject as real as possible. So, Helen writes, 'any teacher can take a child to a classroom, but not every teacher can make them learn.'

Whittier recognised the great work done by Miss Sullivan in exposing Helen to the world of literature, and helping her to develop the passion to understand and appreciate it.

Therefore, Miss Sullivan as on innovative teacher worked like a sculptor 'Chiselling' this little mass of personality (Anne), stroke by stroke, to form her into a perfect figure.

According to Helen, written tests and comprehension made one nervous and one had to mug up things without even understanding them. One's brain, according to her, became encumbered with a plethora of facts and nuggets of information that had little use. Helen observed that her mind was filled with so many things before she sat to take her exam. Helen refers to examinations as the chief bugbears of her college life. She had faced the examinations many times and each time she had emerged a winner. She found examinations to be tiresome and overwhelming. Even though she studied diligently, she sometimes struggled to summon the information needed when the time came to answer the test questions. Despite mugging up the answers, Helen sometimes found that the information she had learned would hardly stick in her memory.

So, when the dreaded how of the examination comes, one would consider ourself a favoured being if one feels prepared, and is able it the right time to call one's standard thoughts. It will help one in the supreme effort. It happens too often that one's call is not paid attention. So, it is most confusing and tiring that at the moment when one needs one's memory and a nice sense of discrimination, these abilities desert him.

Thus, Helen feels that the facts which one had learnt with such extreme trouble invariable fails oneself all of a sudden. This is why she found it hard to write in the exam papers.
